Sligo County Council secured Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF) funding to prepare the first stage of a new public realm enhancement scheme for the Enniscrone Cliff Bath House, Pavilion and Promenade...

The Aims of the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF) :

- Rejuvenate towns and villages
- Support people to live, work and learn in their own community
- Enhance our unique outdoor amenities, culture and heritage
- Strengthen rural economies and achieve economic and social development in these areas
- Re-purpose derelict, disused or heritage buildings
- Deliver tourism infrastructure

In early 2020 Sligo County Council sought to procure a design team to explore the potential of the Cliff Walk site in Enniscrone and to progress the delivery of design solutions.


Following a public tendering competition Dorman Architects with NOJI Architects were appointed in June 2020 for the project.

The proposal for the public realm project involves:

- The conservation of Enniscrone's most iconic building, the Victorian era Cliff Bath House,
- The replacement of the Pavilion Building in the Hollows with a modern landmark building and
- The provision of a significant public realm intervention with regard to the public footpaths and promenade which link these two key sites.
- The project is now at the Public Consultation stage prior to the planning application by the Enniscrone and District Community Council.
